


→ Lute Olson Head coach

Entering his 14th year at Arizona, Rosborough posted a 3-1 record as the head coach at UA in Olson's short absence during the 2000-2001.






• Rodney Tention Asst. head coach

The former UA player was promoted to assistant coach this season. As a player, Pastner never played in a game the Wildcats lost (42-0).




THE PLAYERS

Adams, who prepped at Westchester High in Inglewood, Calif., averaged 18.3 points, 5.4 rebounds and 3.1 assists as a senior




► Rick Anderson Senior Forward, No. 33

As a junior, he averaged 13.1 points and 7.1 rebounds. Anderson is the oldest player on the Wildcat roster (8-10-79).




→ Will Bynum Sophomore Guard, No. 3

The Santa Monica, Calif., native (Crossroads High School) averaged 4.4 points and 4.0 rebounds in nine starts during his freshman campaign.




→ Channing Frye Sophomore Center, No. 45

→ Chris Rodgers Freshman Guard, No. 13

He averaged an Oregon state-best 26.6 points and 5.2 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.4 steals in high school.




→ Salim Stoudamire Sophomore Guard, No. 20




