Pike's troubles

Charter revocation ends chapter's 75 years of tradition, brotherhood

Set against a wall in the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity house lies a broken picture of smiling alumni. The photo rests atop shattered glass, and the faces look out to an overturned pool table and shattered windows — evidence of the destruction of a fraternity that was present at UA for more than 75 years.

For the frustrated members of Pike, the writing was on the wall — literally. Graffiti on one wall inside their house read, "We worked so hard." The message seemed to embody the frustration felt by a fraternity that, over the past year, faced probation, lost UA recognition and finally its national charter.
